➔ Ce cartoon met en évidence l'opposition / inversion entre le bien et le mal, habituellement symbolisé par respectivement le petit cochon et le loup.

Dans le texte du début est écrit : « *Then out of the woods came the MEAN, old wolf* », et à plusieurs reprises on parle du petit cochon la mère disant au début « GOOD little boy », qu'à la fin « *junior, you sweet thing* » ...

Mais dès le début le petit ange devient démon, et plus loin c'est le petit cochon qui devient de + en + méchant et qui dit en rayon le tableau noir: "I'm a mean little kid ... ».

- ✿ Au début le cartoon se présente comme un joli conte : thème + structure typique (répétition de 3)

- Rappel du « pudding » lorsque le cochon fait un gâteau ... ?

➔ **Exercice A:** texte à trous

..... but he couldn't make it.

Wolf: "I'll be back, even if it takes me until Xmas"

So Xmas came (jingle bells)

But meanwhile pillar box: Mr Pig ➔ Mr Mrs Pig ➔ Jr : Exercice B

Dad: "Yes, sir Junior, tonight, Santa Claus with reindeers, coming from the north pole with a sleigh just full of all kinds of toys for all the good little girls and boys."

Mum: "So Junior, if you want a lot of nice toys, you go to sleep and be a **good** little boy."

- **B:** Describing changes: little pig ➔ little angel ➔ little devil

Pig: "Get out of me little bed. Daddy, mummy, do you hear me ?

They **must** be asleep.

I'll now find out what all this Santa Nicolas business is all about.

I got me good brakes, haven't I folks ?" *sliding down the banister*

B: Vocabulary Xmas with transparency

Pig: "Santa Claus, oh Santa Claus, I'm a very **good** little boy, come down, bring me some presents Santa Claus."

B: wolf ➔ behind a tree ➔ Father Christmas

Pig: "Sint Nicolas, what's your, Nick ?"

Wolf: "Merry Christmas, my little man. Now, I know you've **been** a good little boy, haven't you ?"

Pig: "He don't know me very well, folks.

Oh yes, I've **been** a very good little boy; have you got a present for me, have you honey, have you ?"

Wolf: "Yes, it's right here in the bag."

C. Exercice d'anticipation

Pig: "Good night, Mr Wolf."

Wolf: "Good night, my little friend."

D: Sequencing

Simple past (+ pluperfect)

- First find the right order of the actions on the left
- Then complete the sentences on the right
- Actions divided in 2 parts
 - Wolf climbs up the Xmas tree
 - Pig cuts the tree with an axe “take care”
 - Tree falls down
 - Wolf decorated like a Xmas tree (jingle bells)
 - Pig makes cake
 - Pig takes the baked cake out of the oven
 - Wolf bumps into the cake
 - Pig: “I hope you’ll like it, I made it all by my little self.”

Deuxième série d’actions:

« Telegram for Mr Wolf. »

Telegram: Dear Mr Wolf

Don’t look now but your tail is on fire

Love Jr

P.S. SUCKER !!

1. First the little devil delivered a telegram;
2. then the wolf read it;
3. next the wolf looked at his burning tail;
4. then the wolf saw it was on fire;
5. so the wolf filled a bucket with water;
6. then he was going to sit down on it;
7. but the little devil replaced it with one full of gasoline;
8. then the wolf sat down on that one;
9. finally there was an explosion.

- Pig to wolf: “I’ve got something for youuuuuuu
You guess which hand it is in, and you can have it
You got it ! (the wolf is so stupid, and the little pig so mean)”
- Pig with STOP sign: “Stop, don’t come in here; this room is too untidy to to witness
Keep your distance. Get back.
- FIN:

Pig: “Merry Christmas, mummy and pappy.”

Mummy: “Junior, you got a whipping happening to you.”

Pig: “Eh, and you got a present coming to you; merry Christmas mummy.”

Mummy: “ Oh Junior, you **sweet** thing.
A fur coat. Why this coat is just what I need.”

Wolf: “ sister.”
